Hazard Statements

WARNINGS:

- Do NOT apply on or around food and animal feed crops.
- Selective herbicide – very toxic to some plant species.
- **BEWARE: Spray drift hazard. Apply this product carefully. Spray drift may cause serious damage for other desirable plants.**
- Avoid contamination of any water source with product or empty container.
- **HOW IT WORKS:** Prickle Zap works in contact with weed foliage, inhibiting photosynthesis. It is not active in the soil, so weeds must have germinated before spraying (post emergence). As a non-hormonal herbicide, **Prickle Zap** has with no activity against grass species.

MIXING INSTRUCTIONS: Shake the container well before use. Add about half of the water to the spray tank, then add the required amount of product. Mix and add the remaining water to prepare the spray solution. It is best practice to use separate equipment for applying herbicides.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE: Apply using sprayer or fine rose watering can being careful to avoid spray drift.

USE	RATE	COMMENTS
Grass Lawns To control Prickle Weed (Onehunga weed), thistles, plantains, daisies, cape weed and pennycress	10mL in 1 litre of water	Apply 1 litre of spray solution to 5 square metres. Apply to short, evenly mown lawn in warm conditions when lawn weeds are actively growing. Do NOT apply if rain is expected within one day of treatment as effectiveness will be reduced. Do NOT use on dichondra (Mercury Bay Weed) lawns.

EQUIPMENT CLEANING: After application, clean equipment thoroughly with several flushes of water. Dispose of washings carefully.

PERSONAL PROTECTION: Avoid contact with skin and eyes and inhalation of spray mist. Wear protective clothing, gloves, eye protection when mixing or using. Do not eat drink or smoke when handling. Wash hands after handling. Clean protective clothing after use.

FIRST AID: For advice call a doctor or contact the National Poisons Centre (0800 764 766). If medical advice is needed, have product label or container at hand.

IF IN EYES: Rinse cautiously with water for several minutes. Remove contact lenses if present and easy to do. Continue rinsing. If eye irritation persists, get medical advice.

IF ON SKIN: Take off contaminated clothing. Wash skin and hair with plenty of soap and water. If skin irritation or rash occurs; get medical advice/attention. Wash contaminated clothing before reuse.

IF SWALLOWED, Do NOT induce vomiting. Obtain medical advice if you feel unwell.

STORAGE: Keep out of reach of children. Store in the tightly closed original container, in a cool, dry and secure place and away from foodstuffs. Shelf life 2 years from date of manufacture.

DISPOSAL: Dispose of product by using as per label directions or at an approved landfill. Triple rinse empty container adding washings to spray mix. Dispose of the empty rinsed container in the rubbish collection. Do not reuse the container for any other purpose.

SPILLAGE: Collect spillage. Absorb spill with soil/sand and transfer to a labelled sealable container for disposal at an approved landfill.
